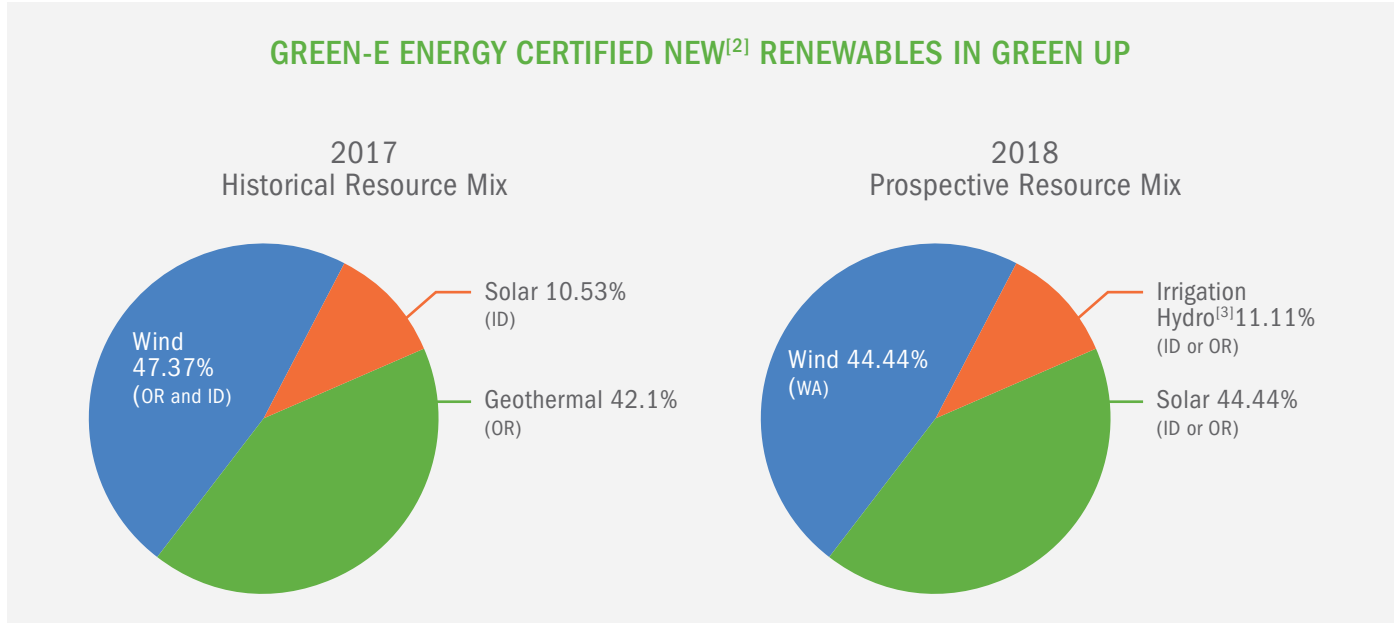


PRODUCT CONTENT LABEL

Green Up is sold in blocks of 200, 400 or 800 kilowatt-hours (kWh). These charts provide the renewable resource mix in Green Up in 2017, as well as the projected resource mix in 2018.



- Prospective figures reflect the renewables that we have contracted to provide. Actual figures may vary according to resource availability. We will annually report to you before August 1 of next year in the form of a Historical Product Content Label the actual resource mix of the electricity you purchased. Historical figures reflect the power delivered to Green Up's customers in 2017.
- New Renewables come from generation facilities that first began commercial operation within the past 15 years.
- Eligible hydroelectric facilities are defined in the Green-e Energy National Standard (<http://www.green-e.org/standard>) and include facilities certified by the Low Impact Hydropower Institute (LIHI) (www.lowimpacthydro.org) and facilities comprised of a turbine in a pipeline or a turbine in an irrigation canal.

For comparison, the current average mix of resources supplying Seattle City Light includes: Hydroelectric 88%, Nuclear** 5%, Wind 4%, Coal** 1%, Natural Gas 1%, Biogas 1%, and Others* 0%. **These fuels represent a portion of the power purchased from BPA and market purchases. * Others include Biomass, Other Non-Biogenic and Petroleum. These fuels only accounted to .30%. This information is provided in compliance with fuel disclosure provisions of the Fuel Mix Disclosure section of RCW 19.29A.010, passed by the Washington State Legislature in 2000 and based on 2016 data.

The average home in the United States uses 897 kWh per month. [Source: U.S. EIA, 2017] SCL purchases GHG offsets in order to neutralize any emissions associated with power delivered to our customers. How will I be billed?	Your bimonthly Seattle City Light bill will include the total of two monthly charges for Green Up.
How will my bill be calculated?	Charges are calculated on your purchases as follows: 200 kWh = \$3.00/month 400 kWh = \$6.00/month 800 kWh = \$12.00/month This purchase is in addition to charges by your electric utility. You will still receive an electricity bill from our utility.
Will by Green Power rates change over time?	Green Up rates are subject to review and revision, but have not changed since the program's inception in 2005.
What resources will be used in my certified product?	See Product Content Label above.
Is there a Green Up termination fee?	No early termination fees are assessed your account.
How long have I agreed to participate in Green Up?	There is no contract requirement. You may stop participating in the program at any time.
What other fees might I be charged?	A \$10 late fee is charged to utility accounts that are 15 days past due. No additional fees are assessed to Green Up customers.
